RESTLOS GLÜCKLICH is based in Berlin (Germany). We're a non-profit organisation dedicated to inspiring people of all ages to reduce food waste through creative educational programmes. Our preschool curriculum teaches children and their educators to value food, avoid food waste and develop a healthy and caring relationship to their everyday meals. We also run interactive cooking classes, community events and personalised workshops.

What makes us innovative?

We work with the youngest members of society, teaching them a different way of viewing food, its production and consumption. We take children on a journey to discover the value of food, the dimensions of food waste and how to reintroduce it into our food cycle to create a circular system. Our programme promotes standards set by the German Association for Nutrition, which are based on the most current scientific findings.

Our fun materials impart a serious message – one which will shape future everyday consumption behaviours and relationships with food in a positive way.

How do we promote inclusivity?

Our relationship to food manifests itself in our early years, making children our most important stakeholders! Our 'little food savers' are learning that their behaviour can make a difference to reducing food waste. We include daycare centres from disadvantaged neighbourhoods in our project and work hand-in-hand with public health and climate action projects. Our resources are free for everyone to download on our website.
