Nature in the City - Advancing Social Impact through NbS

Our sister project <u>CLEVER Cities</u>, in collaboration with the City of Hamburg and ICLEI Europe, will hold its final conference in **September** in **Hamburg**.

The event will take place September 26th and 27th, with an optional welcome

lecture on the 25th, and site visits on the 28th. The central focus event is city perspectives on the co-creation, financing, implementation, and evaluation of nature-based solutions. The event is the culminating output of the Horizon 2020 CLEVER Cities project, and is

envisioned as an opportunity for NbS projects, engaged community members, and committed cities to come together to share their learnings,

The Edible Cities Network Final Project Meeting will take place

September 4-5 in Berlin.

Over the past five years, the Edible Cities Network project has been working towards making cities around the world better places to live through the integration of Edible City Solutions (ECS) in our cities - from urban gardens to vertical farms and community kitchens. Join us for our final project meeting and explore the best practices and lessons learned during the project lifetime - together with representatives of the thirty-two consortium partners, including universities, research institutes, local city administrations, Non-Governmental Organisations (NGOs), Small and Medium Enterprises (SMEs) and other Edible City Solutions around the world.

During the two-day event you will get the chance to hear from the City Teams in the Front Runner Cities, who designed and implemented different ECS—from community-supported agriculture programmes and water recycling technologies to networking strategies for green city initiatives—in their Living Labs. You will also meet representatives of the City Teams in the Follower Cities, who co-developed Edible City Master Plans for their own urban contexts and to tackle specific societal challenges. AIPH World Green City Awards 2024

The AIPH World Green City Awards are the only global awards for cities where plants and nature are the core focus. Designed to champion ambitious nature-orientated approaches to city design and operation, the Awards celebrate bold and innovative action that harnesses the power of plants and nature to create greener, healthier, and more resilient cities. AIPH initiated these awards to bring wide recognition to the value of plants and nature in providing solutions for common city problems and create an enabling environment to shape and nurture a strategic shift in city governance/planning.

The 2024 edition of the AIPH World Green City Awards, which is now open for submissions, is offered in 7 categories, with 3 finalists in each category from which one category winner is selected, and with 1 Grand Winner selected from the 7 category winners. New to the 2024 edition is a category specifically dedicated to "Living Green for Urban Agriculture and Food Systems." Please note that the call is open only to city authorities.
